Higher Photography

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Course Outline

There are 2 units in the course:

Image Making

In this unit pupils will learn the manual camera settings and how to compose images. They will relate this to the work of famous photographers and will research the development of technology and the historical and cultural context. Pupils will use the local environment in and around Haddington as subject matter.

Contextual Imagery

In this unit pupils will develop their own creative approaches to photography through two small projects, by planning, producing images and editing in Photoshop. These projects will allow pupils to explore different styles and genres.



Exam Preparation

There is no formal exam for Photography. An evaluation of the final project will be completed before pupils go on study leave. This is done under exam conditions but is an "open book" assessment- pupils can refer to their project notes and images.

Project

Pupils also complete a Personal Project which forms the course assessment. This includes planning, editing and evaluating 12 high quality images. Final images must be available for printing by 15^{th} May. The final deadline is 2^{nd} June 2016.
