Course Outline

The Higher Psychology course is designed to introduce learners to psychology as the scientific study of human behaviour. There are three main units within the Higher course;

- Psychology Research
- Psychology Social Behaviour (Mandatory topic of Conformity and Obedience and an optional topic for example Prejudice)
- Psychology Individual Behaviour (Mandatory topic of Sleep, Dreams and Sleep Disorders and an optional topic for example Stress or Psychopathology).

Pupils will complete a Research Assignment which will account for 40% of their overall grade. Candidates will also undertake a final SQA exam which will include questions on these three areas of study.

Exam Preparation

As the Higher Psychology exam approaches, pupils should carry out as much timed practise of exam questions as possible, as well as increasing the volume of reading they complete. The Psychology exam is divided into three sections each worth 20 marks. 40 minutes is allocated to each 20 mark section therefore pupils should prepare by practising these sections under timed conditions. Pupils will have the opportunity to carry out exam practise in class also.
